# A Letter from the Director



We have a long road ahead of us to ensure every baby reaches their first birthday, but we know, thanks to your support, we'll continue to make strides.

In 2022, Healthier Moms and Babies' board, staff, partners, volunteers and donors showed unparalleled dedication to our mission of reducing the infant mortality rate in Allen County. Each and every one of them wears their heart on their sleeves and supports this community with an above-and-beyond approach. I am awed at their commitment and generosity to uplift our most vulnerable neighbors through programming, resources and education.

This last year, in addition to our ongoing in-home programs and educational classes, we collected 100,000 diapers and wipes during our second annual Community-Wide Diaper Drive. But we didn't stop there. Our team mobilized diaper distribution, delivering 22,000 diapers in November and December to 441 babies in our area.

While we celebrate these accomplishments, we still have work to do. As we continue to help our littlest community members lead healthy, happy lives, it's important to step back and look at their families, too. Infant mortalities and maternal mortalities go hand-in-hand, and according to the 2022 Indiana State Department of Health Infant Mortality Report, Indiana has the third highest maternal mortality rate in the nation.

Mental health is a crisis for mothers in our country, affecting one in five women. And these conditions impact not only mothers, but also their babies and families. Many of Healthier Moms and Babies' families have expressed a need for mental health services, so we added a therapist to our staff in 2022. It's the first step of many to ensure maternal mental health needs are met.

We have a long road ahead of us to ensure every baby reaches their first birthday, but we know, thanks to your support, we'll continue to make strides. Thank you for helping us meet the moment of every family in our community.

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# Home Visiting



# Fatherhood

### **CARLOS'S STORY**

Carlos connected with our programming as he was preparing to be a new dad with his partner, Christy; as Christy gained insight from her home visitor, Carlos sought a father-centered support system. In his one-on-one sessions, Carlos received education on what to expect during Christy's pregnancy and encouragement on how to support his growing family. He values the community he found with the biweekly dad's group. The ability to share, learn, and grow with other members of his community has helped shape who he is as a father.

Children with involved fathers and positive role models have a strong foundation for child well-being and are at a lower risk for poor birth and childhood outcomes. Our fatherhood initiative provides mentorship, education, and a community for dads, partners, and caregivers to learn and grow.





# Cribs for Kids

Unsafe sleep is one of the leading causes of infant mortality—and it can be prevented. Every family in our programs is educated on the importance and best ways to practice safe sleep; if they don't have a safe place for their baby to sleep, we can provide a pack-n-play. We work to understand and remedy barriers preventing our families from creating safe sleep environments.

### **ADRIANA'S STORY**

Adriana enrolled in our home visitation services, seeking help with her twin pregnancy and support in her native language. With two babies on the way, Adrianna's needs doubled. Without Healthier Moms and Babies, Adriana and her family would not have been able to afford a safe place for her babies to sleep. Their case manager delivered two pack-n-plays, provided encouraging education, and continues to check in during their monthly visits to ensure they continue creating a safe sleep environment.

# Maternal Mental Health

### **MAYRA'S STORY**

Through sessions with our licensed therapist, Mayra uncovered and processed her trauma and abuse; this barrier caused her to sacrifice her health and well-being. Through one-on-one treatment and our women's empowerment group, she gained confidence and acceptance. Prioritizing your mental and physical health is crucial in creating a healthy future for your whole family. Mayra has found peace and continues to build up the other women in her empowerment group.

Through one-on-one therapy and empowerment groups, mental health is a priority for each of our families. Our 2023 infant mortality report found that nearly half of the respondents struggled with mental health-related stressors. We screen every client for perinatal mood disorders and support the whole family.

# Own Your Journey

When our Own Your Journey participants own their journeys, they're establishing healthy groundwork that will follow them for generous to come. Led by knowledgeable facilitators, each group learns accountability, goal-setting, and the importance of prioritizing their personal wellness. By creating a healthy lifestyle before they choose to become pregnant, they reduce their risk of poor birth outcomes in the future.

### **LUZ'S STORY**

After a difficult pregnancy, Luz joined Own Your Journey to learn how to maintain a healthy lifestyle with young children, practice self-care, and address her personal needs. In our wellness classes, fellow moms discuss goals, experiences, and hardships. With a community of like-minded women, Luz felt more sure of herself as a mom and as an individual; she began prioritizing her own needs as well as the needs of her family. Empowered by the confidence she gained, Luz joined our women empowerment group to continue on her journey.

# Diaper Distribution

In November, we were excited to increase our ability to address the diaper need in our community. Starting with our clients, we began distributing up to 50 diapers per child per month.

In March of 2023, we launched this initiative to the public with the debut of our Dar Richardson Hopper Mobile Unit. In just the last two months of 2022, we provided over 22,000 diapers for over 400 babies in our community. By providing diapers, we're addressing a need that can otherwise lead to a higher risk for poor birth outcomes and complications. By keeping babies clean, dry, and healthy, we help reduce anxiety and stress for the families as well as the risk of rash or infection for the babies.



# Doula Support

We care about being the right resource, for the right person, at the right time. Through the launch of our doula services, we can support our families and help them achieve the healthiest, most satisfying experience possible.


Our doula coordinator began serving clients in late 2022; her five new doulas were trained in early 2023 and are excited to start providing this free service to our parents. Having a doula can decrease the risk of a NICU visit, reduce the need and use of pain medication, and overall improve the birthing experience.

# Irene's Impact






Our future is here at our doorstep, and we shouldn't turn our backs. Caring for moms and infants makes for a better future and outcomes!


